# Highlights



The Leadership Roundtable hosted in Broome provided peer training for regions to host their own gatherings.



Created opportunities for women to recognise and value their leadership, cultural knowledge, mentoring & transferable community skills.



The project strengthened connections between Aboriginal women, communities and organisations across multiple regions.

# Challenges



- Project Coordinator recruitment
- Building trust across regions
- Cultural obligations, travel, seasonal access and community responsibilities across WA required flexible and relationship-based engagement.

# Key Outcomes

- Supported women's collectives through shared resources, mentoring, connection and collaboration, including governance support for the Southwest collective's incorporation and organisational setup.
- Increased recognition of Aboriginal women's leadership, mentoring and transferable community skills.
- Strengthened regional networks and relationships between Aboriginal women, communities and organisations across WA.



## What's Next

### The Impact Continues

The Ripple Effect will continue through peer mentoring, ongoing community gatherings, women-led leadership networks and shared tools that communities can adapt to suit their own regional needs, priorities and readiness.
